Highway Department March 2012 Monthly Report:

During the month of March our full crew conducted snow and ice removal operations two times.

The fewer storms this year has allowed us time to perform preventive maintenance on our trucks and equipment:

We have continued work on our 2002 Tri-Axle dump truck. Sandblasting was finished and body work done.

We prepared our sweeping equipment for spring road cleanup.

This month we concentrated on trimming limbs on several roads. This is done for safety reasons such as preventing school busses and trucks from striking branches that extend over the driving lanes. Roads worked on included Breezy Hill and North Mountain.

We spent one day raking and cleaning up around the parking lots that we plow.

Another task that we try to complete in the spring is picking up trash along the roads. This month we worked on Snyder Pond and Farm roads.
