## Bob Bernstein Presentation Description of the Plan for the Agriculture Center in Copake:

- 1. Purchase large parcel of land (four properties in Copake, will be owned by Farmland Renewal, LLC).
- 2. Lease land long term (8 years) to multiple farmers, both new and established.
- 3. Land not yet purchased.
- 4. Binders are in on multiple parcels.
- 5. Set to close sometime in December
- 6. Three farmers currently on board with plan.
- 7. Will eventually offer farmer education programs
  - 1. Programs on scaling up
  - 2. Business training programs
- 8. Final component of plan will consist of ag tourism (idea to use one of the properties as rental/vacation house).
- 9. Will be adding an additional round of looking for proposals from farmers interested in raising livestock.
