Highway Department July 2015 Monthly Report:

Motor paved Cambridge Road. This process is a cold mix stone and oil mixture overlaying the existing pavement. We will next apply a single chip seal to finish.

After paving Cambridge we installed gravel shoulders and blacktop aprons to protect the edges of the new pavement

We continued the annual cleaning of the ditches on our gravel roads.

Roads worked on were: Bain, Twin Bridges ext., Cambridge, Dan B., Burdick and Sunset Rock roads

After the ditches are cleaned of debris and reshaped to carry rain runoff, we grade, gravel and apply liquid calcium to the road surface.

Roads completed were: Bain, Burdick and Sunset Rock roads

We repaired road signs for one day

Pothole patched for one day

Installed a catch basin and dry well on Bain road

We continued road side mowing; this will continue into the fall

Spent one day chipping downed trees and limbs following a heavy wind/rain storm
